STRENGTH:-

(1) Student shows great interest in attending my class. I cover their basic knowledge of high-school after admission in UG classes. Though, their basic knowledge is poor.

(2) Because of that, the students of this rural area try to get good marks in the annual Exams. As an example:-In 2015-16 session; 03 out of 15 passed-students got >70%, 02 other get more than 60% marks in B.Sc.-III annual. Overall 16, out of 74 students appeared in first division. In B.Sc.-I Year 02 got more than 75%, 10 got more than 60%, and in B.Sc.-II 08 student got more than 60%.

WEAKNESS:-

- (1) School level basic knowledge is poor. They do not consult reference book and read from guide.
- (2) Since English knowledge is poor, so student can't benefit of reference books available in library
- (3) There is no teaching-learning environment in the surrounding of student except in college.

OPPORTUNITIES:-

- (1) Education campuses are very dense in this region.
- (2) Other than Post-graduate courses in District place and Research courses in the Raipur university, 36 KM apart from Patan, the diploma course of one year PGDCA and two year M.Sc. course is available in this college.
- (3) PG courses in so many subjects are available near 30 km of distance in Durg-Bhilai twin city and Raipur.
- (4) Durg university, Ravishankar university are two universities. Further, one IIT, one IIIT, one agricultural university IGKV, one Ravishankar university are available in Raipur about 36 KM distance. Further, one university (Durg), one Kamdhenu university, one technical university are available in Durg-Bhilai, 25 KM distance.

CHALLENGES:

- (1) There is a challenge to overcome the weak base of mathematics and science from school level.
- (2) Many students receive scholarship; it is challenge to purchase text-books from this money for himself.
